PROFESSOR

Dr. Klaus Detlev Schulz, Th.D.

Dr. Schulz has been an associate professor in the Department of Pastoral Ministry and Missions at CTS since Fall of 1998. From 1994-1998 Dr. Schulz was a missionary in Serowe, Botswana for the Lutheran Church Mission of the S.E.L.K. (Independent Evangelical-Lutheran Church in Germany). He also served as a guest lecturer at CTS during the Fall Quarter 1997.

In 1984 Dr. Schulz earned his B.A. degree at the University of Natal, Pietermaritzburg, South Africa. In 1988 he successfully completed his M.Div. Studies at the Lutherische Theologische Hochschule, Oberursel, Germany. In 1990 he earned his S.T.M. degree at Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne. He then served in the S.E.L.K. as vicar in Heidelberg, Germany, from 1990-1992. In 1994 he concluded his studies at Concordia Seminary by earning a Th.D. in Systematics and Mission. Dr. Schulz is presently the Chairman of the Pastoral Ministry and Missions Department at CTS and supervisor of the Ph.D. in Missiology program.

COURSE

“The Doctrine of Church and Fellowship”

The practice of church fellowship occurs on a number of levels: congregation, synod, or in the mission field. Church fellowship is determined by a properly understood ecclesiology. This course will examine the underlying aspects of church and fellowship with Werner Elert’s *Eucharist and Church Fellowship* and CTCR statements relating to these issues. In addition to questions of church and fellowship involving pulpit and altar, inter-church services, overseas partnership, cooperation in mission and in external matters, this course also pays close attention to Christianity’s faith in the Triune God as it confronts other religions.
