If you look closely at Ephesians 2:10, you will read that we do not DO the workmanship of God, but rather we ARE the workmanship of God. Created in Christ Jesus for good works. Each of us has been prepared by God to be who He wants us to be.

What steps can you take to intentionally discover your ministry identity, the workmanship of God already in place in your life? Whether you are a rookie or veteran Christian, come along on your own further discovery of God's internal crafting!

You and I are saved by grace, and, as the passage Ephesians 2:8-9 says, not by you (verse 8) or your works (verse 9). It is God's free gift of grace undeservedly offered to each of us who are unable to earn it on our own. Yet he freely offers it. We do not, cannot, work for it.

What if the process is actually one of **discovering that which already exists** in each of us? Ephesians 2:10 reveals the beginning step of our search. As we respond to His grace, each of us becomes the very workmanship of God. He "graces" us with His favor, and we are already prepared by the Father to be His workmanship.
